

A government Emergency Ordinance has been issued in Romania, establishing a “National System for the Monitoring of Road Transport of Goods on the National Territory”. As a result of the new regulations, specific domestic shipments and international shipments, to and from Romania, now require reporting under the Romanian National e-Transport System. A UTI code (IUT in Romanian) will be issued for each relevant shipment, which is used to further identify goods. While e-Transport regulations are already in force, fines for non-compliance will start being applied from July 1, 2024.

Reporting is mandatory for shipments exceeding 500 kg or 10,000 lei (approximately 2,000 euro). Postal shipments, defined as any shipment with a gross weight of 31.5 kg or less, are exempt.

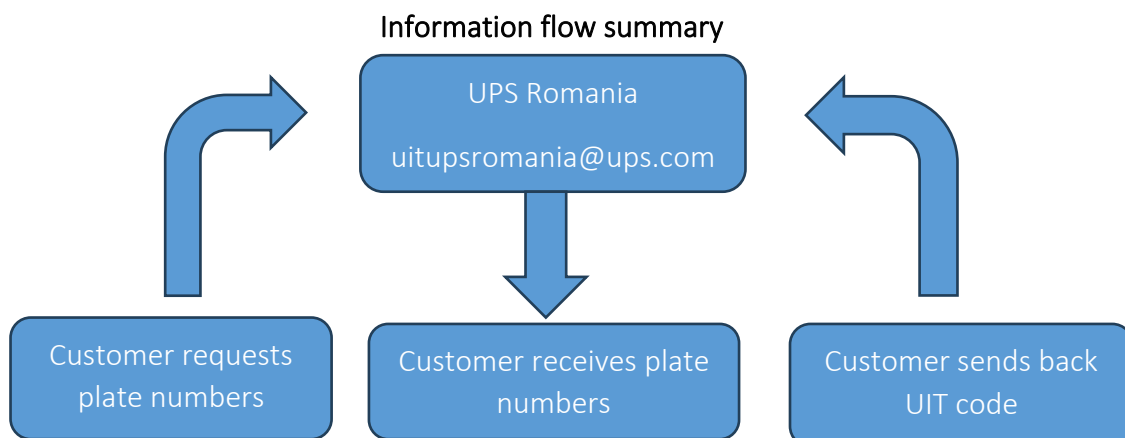
To obtain a UTI code, Romanian shippers, or consignees must acquire the plate numbers of the vehicles that will be used for the transportation of the shipments within the national territory. This obligation applies only to the taxpayers in Romania, both business entities and private individuals.

If a shipment arranged through UPS by you, as a shipper or consignee, falls under the e-Transport regulations, please send a request for information to the email address: uitupsromania@ups.com, specifying the following details:

- For an outbound / export shipment: UPS tracking number, pick up date, pick up location (city & postal code), UPS service used and destination country
- For an inbound / import shipment: UPS tracking number, origin country, UPS service used, delivery location (city & postal code)

Within 2 working hours, you will receive back the following information from the same email address:

- For an outbound / export shipment:
 - Example: Ground shipment from Bucharest to France
 - Tracking number: 1Z452EXXX44553333
 - Vehicle number: XX12UPS, Date 6 Jul 24, Approx timelines
- For an inbound / import shipment:
 - Example: Ground shipment from France to Bucharest
 - Tracking number: 1Z452EXXX44553333
 - Vehicle number: XX20XYZ, Date 5 Jul 24, Approx timelines



If the vehicle plate numbers change after the initial information is provided, we will provide the new plate number from the same email address, allowing you to update the information in the e-Transport system.

Once you receive the UTI code, please send it back to us (to uitupsromania@ups.com), as a reply to our initial information, but do so before the vehicle starts moving on the national territory. This is crucial to avoid significant fines for non-compliance.

Additionally, as intra-community shipments move without a commercial invoice, we do not assume responsibility for any consequences resulting from not obtaining the UTI code for an eligible shipment (due to the value of the goods) or not sending it back to us.

We have attached the User Guide of the National System on the Monitoring of Road Transport of Goods RO e-Transport, a document recently issued by ANAF, for your reference and use.
